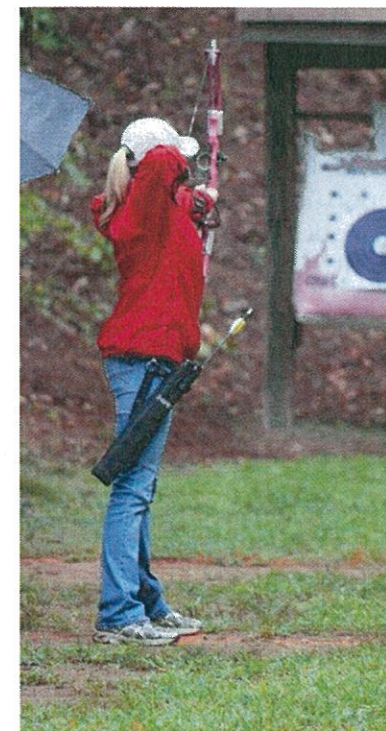

# BOTETOURT 4-H SHOOTING EDUCATION CLUB INFORMATION

## WHO ARE WE?

The Botetourt County 4-H Shooting Education club members are a diverse group - boys and girls sharing one common interest - **shooting, a desire to be safe, learn more, and have fun.** The club was organized to provide youth in Botetourt County the opportunity to learn about and have fun in shooting by participating in a family oriented, outdoor program.

## WHO CAN JOIN?

The 4-H program is open to all youth ages 9 - 19 as of September 30 of the current year. Any young person, male or female, may participate and join if they are wanting to learn more and be with other youth with similar interests. Not all club members are experienced at shooting; some are first timers and some are very experienced.

## HOW TO JOIN?

Members accepted once a year in October. Interested youth ages 9 - 19 should contact the Botetourt County Extension Office, (540)473-8260, to place their name on the waiting list. Meeting dates, times, and practice sessions announced at the beginning of the program year.

Hands on training in shooting education

All members enroll in at least one 4-H project book and are encouraged to complete it as a way to learn more about shooting education as well as a means of recording 4-H activities for the year.

Members are encouraged to participate in the local practices, 4-H Shooting Education Camps, District Shoots, County Matches, State Shoots, and National Shoots.

Members are encouraged to participate in community service projects as a club as well as individually. Most clubs conduct several community service projects each year.

Members are encouraged to participate in other county, district and state 4-H activities and contests.

Involve the parents and adults through volunteer opportunities in helping with club activities to being certified instructors.
