WHO ARE WE?

The Botetourt County 4-H Kids & Critters Club members are a diverse group of boys and girls with different animal interests including livestock, pets and poultry. The club was organized to provide the youth of Botetourt County opportunities to learn about animal care, and show livestock and poultry.

WHO CAN JOIN?
