WHO ARE WE?

The Botetourt 4-H Honey Bee Club members are a diverse group of boys and girls sharing one common interest – **to learn about honey-bees, how to maintain hives safely, gathering honey, learn more and have fun!** The club was organized to provide youth in Botetourt County the opportunity to learn about honeybees and their hives in a “hands on” outdoor program.

WHO CAN JOIN?

The 4-H program is open to all youth ages 9 – 19 as of September 30 of the current year. Any young person, male or female, may participate and join if they are wanting to learn more about beekeeping and be with other youth with similar interests. You do not have to have a hive or protective clothing to join.

WHAT DO WE DO?

Attend 4-H Club meeting (usually once a month unless extra activities are planned)

- Elect Officers
- Conduct club business
- Educational programs, speakers, and hands-on instruction
- Plan activities
- Manage hives safely

Receive hands-on training in beekeeping by a qualified 4-H Leader. Members will have the opportunity to have a 4-H hive placed on their property to maintain and gather honey. Members will be trained on how to handle beehives safely before hives are placed.

All members enroll in at least one 4-H project book and are encouraged to complete it as a way to learn more about beekeeping as well as a means of recording 4-H activities for the year.

Members are encouraged to participate in community service projects as a club as well as individually. Most clubs conduct several community service projects each year.

Members are encouraged to participate in other county, district and state 4-H activities and contests.

Involve the parents and adults through volunteer opportunities in helping with club activities.
