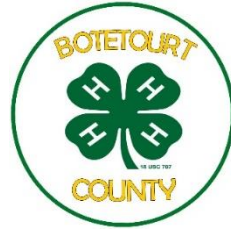


WHAT 4-H CAN DO FOR YOU!
